As presented to this Summary Court, this writ of mandamus fails to fulfill the minimal formal requirements necessary for its merits to be ruled upon.

Such deficiency does not, however, pose an unsurmountable obstacle.

First and foremost, a proper identification of the patient is evidently in order, especially considering the nature of this mandamus. As such, a copy of his civil register is to be duly filed alongside the writ.

Secondly, I notice a severe frailty to the link between the request and the grounds upon which it stands. Although the reasoning behind the patient's demand can be inferred as it is, the lack of clarity prevents this Court from acknowledging the illegal abuse or coercion inflicted upon the patient's rights, which is *a sine qua non* condition for the admissibility of this writ. Otherwise this Court would be dealing in inferences and oblique interpretations, which is to be thoroughly avoided, as it not only threatens equity and due process, but also the credibility of our jurisprudence.

I therefore offer the patient a term of **fifteen workdays** for the thorough rectification of the writ, after which this Court shall examine the merits therein conveyed.
